His Most Royal Excellency and Lord, Frederick Augustus¹, Duke of Saxony etc., Arch-Marshal of the Holy Roman Empire and Prince Elector etc., having most graciously instructed myself, Peter August von Schoenberg², Major-Domo, to arrange for the entire nameable furnishings and effects in the Prince Elector's Japanese *Palais* to be inventoried anew and accurately itemised, I duly commissioned Johann George Angern³, the Major-Domoship Secretary, to attend to the proper drafting of such an inventory, the latter successively putting this to effect as follows in the company of the bedmaster employed, Joseph Lechner⁴,

II. Saxon Porcelain, marked throughout with the letter W.

a) Garnitures, bottles, beakers, figures and dolls.

[a) Garnitures, bottles, beakers, figures and dolls]

Two gadrooned vases, the foot on one different, both are heavily fire-cracked and have no knops on their covers, 23 inches high, 11 inches in diam. **No. 4.**

Two somewhat smaller, heavily fire-cracked ditto, 21½ inches high, 9 inches in diam. **No. 5.**

Two large circular beakers with sprigged rose leaves and small Pallas heads, gadrooned feet, ditto flat covers and double knops. Both have heavy fire-cracks and one cover is missing, 20 inches high, 10 inches in diam. **No. 6.**

One 1-piece garniture, cracked during firing, comprising: one leafwork-sprigged bottle, a squashed belly, a separate circular foot, a long neck that widens at the mouth and a cover, 22 inches high, 7 inches in diam. **No. 8.**

8 inches in diam. **No. 13.**

Two goblets sprigged with rose leaves and small Pallas heads and having small gadrooned knops on their covers and ditto circular feet, 13 and 15 inches high, 6 inches in diam. Have fire-cracks. **No. 15.**

One covered circular garniture jar sprigged with 2 lions' heads, 9 inches high, 3 inches in diam. **No. 64.**

Two quadrangular bottles

[fol. 6r] with raised and gilded ornament and covers, 9½ inches high, 3½ inches wide. **No. 69.**

Four cupids, with flowers, likewise a woman playing the violin, sprigged, with flat covers, 8½ inches high, 3 inches in diam. **No. 71.**

Two ditto sprigged with rose leaves and angels' heads, plus covers, 9½ inches high, 3½ inches wide. 1 cover is missing. **No. 73.**

Two smooth like [*inserted, in B: bottles*], 8½ inches high, 3½ inches wide. **No. 74.**

[C: 4 Bot. plus, one cover is missing.]

[fol. 6v] Four smooth bottles with circular bellies into which a little spout has been fitted, with long necks and high circular covers, 9½ inches high, 4½ inches in diam. 1 somewhat lower. **No. 75.**

One John the Evangelist statue, 18 inches high. **No. 80.**
