His Most Royal Excellency and Lord, Frederick Augustus¹, Duke of Saxony etc., Arch-Marshal of the Holy Roman Empire and Prince Elector etc., having most graciously instructed myself, Peter August von Schoenberg², Major-Domo, to arrange for the entire nameable furnishings and effects in the Elector's Japanese Palace to be inventoried anew and accurately itemised, I, the Major-Domo Peter August von Schoenberg, duly commissioned Johann George Angern³, the Major-Domoship Secretary, to attend to the proper drafting of such an inventory, the latter successively putting this to effect as follows in the company of the bedmaster employed, Joseph Lechner⁴,

IV. a) Green Chinese Porcelain.

These porcelains are marked with the cipher [Roman Numeral One] throughout.

a) Garnitures, figures and dolls.

A garniture of 3 bottle beakers with everted rims and gilt necks, 1 cubit 7 in. high and 12 in. in diam. **No. 1.**

One ditto of 2 like beakers but with no gilding. **No. 2.**

One ditto of 2 cylindrical bottles with long necks and offset, everted, gilt-rimmed mouths, 1 cubit 6 in. high, 10 in. in diam. **No. 3.**

A 5-piece garniture comprising: 3 round jars, one badly damaged, with round covers, upon each of which sits a blue-and-green lion, 23 in. high, 13 in. in diam.; and two beakers, 21 in. high, 9¾ in. in diam. One of these has a cracked rim. **No. 4.**

A 5-piece garniture comprising: one octagonal jar with short neck and like cover; 2 hexagonal ditto in the shape of bottles with short necks and like covers surmounted by white knops with red roses, 23½ in. high, 8 in. in diam.; and 2 hexagonal bottle beakers with short everted necks ornamented in gilt, 18½ in. high, 6 in. in diam. **No. 5.**

Two 5-piece garnitures, each comprising: 3 round jars in the shape of bottles with short necks and covers that are each surmounted by a gilt lion instead of a knop, 1 cubit 1 in. high, 8½ in. in diam.; and 2 beakers with flat-bulbed bellies and everted rims, 20½ in. high, 10 in. in diam. NB: 2 bottles, 2 beakers and 3 covers are damaged. **No. 6.**

A garniture of 3 tall four-sided bottles with short round everted necks, their rims ornamented in gilt, 20½ in. high, 6½ in. in diam. There is damage to the rim on 2. **No. 7.**

One ditto of 3 like bottles, but with no gilding. **No. 8.**

One ditto of 2 like bottles and 1 round jar in the shape of a bottle with a long everted neck, 19½ in. high, 7 in. in diam. **No. 9.**

One round jar with cover surmounted by a polychrome knop, 21 in. high[,] 8½ in. in diam.; and a companion round beaker with flat-bulbed belly and everted neck, 19½ in. high, 10 in. in diam. **No. 10.**

A garniture of 3 round covered jars with blue knops, 15 in. high, 10 in. in diam. **No. 11.**

One round jar with cover surmounted by a blue knop. **No. 12.**

A garniture of 3 round jars with like flat covers, 10¼ in. high, 8½ in. in diam. **No. 13.**

One ditto of 4 jars with varying decorative detail. **No. 14.** 1 cover broken.

A 6-piece garniture comprising: 4 round green bottles with raised flowers and long, double-bulbed necks that flare out at the top, 19¼ in. high, 18½ in. in diam.; and 2 companion beakers with flat-bulbed bellies and everted necks, 19½ in. high, 9¾ in. in diam. **No. 15.**

Eight bottles of a sort with raised flowers and long bulbed necks, 12 in. high, 5½ in. in diam. 1 is in poor condition. **No. 16.**

Four bottles of a sort with raised flowers and double-bulbed, somewhat everted necks, 9¾ in. high, 4½ in. in diam. **No. 17.**

Two fountains that can be hung on a wall, each in the shape of a semicircular garniture jar, at their base a polychrome lion's head fitted with a gilded brass spigot. **No. 18.**

A 5-piece garniture comprising: 3 ribbed jars with short necks and covers surmounted by a white-and-green knop, though 2 of these are missing, 15 in. high, 6 in. in diam.; and 2 like beakers with broad everted rims, 13¼ in. high, 5 in. in diam. 1 cover is missing. **No. 19.**

A 5-piece garniture comprising: 3 round jars with slightly raised panels, short necks and white-knopped covers, 13 in. high, 5½ in. in diam.; and 2 like beakers, 12½ in. high, 5½ in. in diam. 1 jar is cracked. **No. 20.**

A 4-piece garniture comprising: 2 spirally moulded jars with short necks and red-knopped covers, one of which is missing, 12½ in. high, 5½ in. in diam.; and 2 like beakers with everted rims. **No. 21.**

One 5-piece ditto comprising: 3 four-sided jars with shaped corners, short necks and covers, each of which is surmounted by a gilded wooden grape, 13 in. high, 5 in. in diam.; and 2 like flower jars with handles, though these are damaged, 12½ in. high, 5½ in. in diam. **No. 24.**

A 5-piece garniture comprising: 3 small, round, spirally ribbed jars with short necks and green-knopped covers, 9½ in. high, 4 in. in diam.; and 2 like beakers, 8¾ in. high, 4¾ in. in diam. **No. 28.**

One small garniture of 3 round jars, one of which is damaged, 6 in. high, 3½ in. in diam. **No. 37.**

Two ditto with gilded brass covers housing cork stoppers, 9¼ in. high, 3½ in. in diam. **No. 48.**

Two four-sided, blue-and-yellow striped bottles with short, wide, somewhat everted necks, 10½ in. high, 4 in. in diam. **No. 49.**

Four tall, four-sided, quadruply-indented flower jars with everted mouths, 12½ in. high, 3½ in. in diam. Are in poor condition. **No. 70.**

[fol. 11r] Three heathen temples, each in the shape of a mountain on which there are trees, cottages, a tower, trelliswork, pagods, dogs and birds, with some damage to these here and there, 1 cubit high and 10 in. wide at the bottom. **No. 71.**

Four cats with gilt collars on long pedestals. 2 are suckling their young, the other two holding a green ribbon in their paws, 19 in. high, 8 in. in diam. **No. 72.**

Two ditto grotesques, with moving eyes, sitting on openwork pedestals, one with an eye missing, both with a crooked yellow stick on their backs, 8 in. high, 4 in. in diam. **No. 73.**

Two ditto seated cats with moving eyes and ears, one with an eye missing, one of their young in their right paw, 7 in. high, 4 in. in diam. **No. 74.**

[fol. 11v] One seated green stag, with antlers as removable cover and tail as handle, that can be used as a teapot, 9 in. high, 5 in. long. **No. 75.**

Two green-and-yellow cats on like openwork pedestals, 6½ in. high, 5 in. long. **No. 76.**

Six small standing cats with moving eyes. These are missing on two, 3 are holding one of their young in their paws, the other 3 movable openwork knobs, 3¾ in. high, 3½ in. long. **No. 77.**

Two lions sitting on pedestals, a gilt ball in their paw, 4½ in. high, 2½ in. long. **No. 78.**

Two yellow horses with green-and-brown saddles and one like, somewhat taller specimen with a green-and-yellow saddle. **No. 79.**

Four cockerels standing before a mountain in front of which stands a green tree with red flowers, 5 in. high and wide. **No. 80.**

Two ditto, somewhat different, on one of which a foot is missing and on the other the head, 4½ in. high and in diam. **No. 81.**

One seated pagod wearing black boots and a white-and-red cap. In poor condition. **No. 82.**

Two polychrome mountains with flowers, in each of which stands a boy wearing a red coat, 4 in. high, 2½ in. in diam. **No. 83.**

Two pedestals with small trees, on one of which stands a white hare, on the other a stork. **No. 84.**

Three small pots with flowers, some damage, 3 in. high. **No. 85.**

Two green and two red parrots with red beaks and green wings sitting on openwork pedestals, 10 in. high. **No. 90.**

Nine pagods sitting on pedestals, 6½ in. high, 2½ in. in diam. 4 are in poor condition. **No. 91.**

Three female ditto with holes in their backs sitting on pedestals, 7 in. high, 2 in. in diam. **No. 92.**

Two Indian priests sitting before mountains, 5 in. high. **No. 95.**

Two Indian women with children, mostly gilt, 6 in. high. **No. 96.**

Eight pagods standing on pedestals, variously dressed in yellow, green, and also brown, 4½ in. high. 1 broken. **No. 100.**

Eight mice of varying colour with holes in their backs, 3½ in. long. **No. 101.**

Three pagods asleep against pots, 2 in. high. **No. 103.**
